



After chemotherapy and then a mastectomy, an infection which resulted in the removal of a tissue expander and then the subsequent surgery to replace the expander, she has recently completed all of her expansions for reconstruction and is awaiting the first of the last two surgeries in July. So has Mr. Pete, who cancelled all of his meetings to be by her side, do endless loads of laundry in the dorm, make breakfast each morning for 16 hungry kids and be her constant encouragement.
