


ADULLAM HOUSE IS A SAFE HAVEN FOR THE CHILDREN OF INCARCERATED PARENTS.

As the excitement continues at Adullam House this month, Brother Pete has been in Argentina, experiencing revival in the prisons there! In a women's prison where over 90 children are incarcerated with their mothers, he ministered and prayed for the lost with great compassion and anointing. At a meeting with the Minister of Security, God gave him an open door to all 51 prisons in that country. In the men's prisons he found many inmates who had already found Christ in a very real way and were desperate for teaching. One prison alone, had a population of 400 saved men. He now plans to return, armed with the School of Christ and take these prisons by storm, equipping these men to live their lives to the fullest that God intended.
