

they want to be *normal*




For the last 20 years, *Adullam House has consumed our lives.* It started back in the early 90's as a dream that burned in our hearts and would not go away. During the *first 7 years*, God provided both the land and the materials to build our first home. In the *four years that followed*, we battled to break legal ground and work with the prison system. *Since then many, many babies and children have come through our home and through our hearts.* We have learned what works and what doesn't, as we endeavor, with excellence, to raise other peoples' children. We have loved (and lost) many little ones, who have stolen our hearts and then broken them, as they have had to leave to go home. We have been unable to protect ourselves from hurt, as we have found that the only way to really make a difference, is to *love without reservation and handle the pain of losing when it comes.* We can easily name those children who completely won us over and now are no longer with us. A simple photograph can elicit rueful cries of "*aaahhh*" from our workers, as they see some precious little face that was special to them. Sometimes our mothers contact us to let us know how well they are doing. Occasionally we get the sad news that a mother has returned to prison. One thing we know—God is in control of it all.

God intervenes in the affairs of men, by invitation only.

We used to sing a song in Scotland; "*Precious moments, privileged people.*" How often am I reminded of that song, as I watch our kids grow before our eyes! We have so little time to instill in them all that they will need for life. Molly, my granddaughter, and Coreen, (pictured right), are getting so big! Just think, when Molly is nine, I may only have a meager 96 months to love on her, before she is off to college! For Coreen—that time may be *much* shorter. Not knowing how long we have him here at Adullam House, makes every moment *very* precious..





Never a dull moment!

This month two of our inmate mothers have accepted Christ as their Savior. We had heard that one of them had wept her way to salvation, as a close friend of one of our staff members had prayed with her. A few days later she sent a letter to her son, aged 9, who lives here at Adullam House. In simple terms she told him what she had done and asked him to pray for her. She also sent him some scriptures to read. *How we need to pray for these ladies, that they will beat all the odds and walk with God.* Our other newly saved mom told us, "it seems like all the other women who go to Church here, are 'phonies' ". "That doesn't mean that *you* have be one," we encouraged her. Pray with us, for these girls, that they will find the strength that they need to be real with the Lord and surrender completely to Him. *Many of them are just little girls themselves.*

We have prayed so long that God would send us laborers for the Harvest. How thankful we are that He has heard our prayers!

This month we have been joined by Enrique Rivera, DeeDee (below), Amanda and Patrick Kucharski, (all from Times Square Church in New York) as well as several young ladies from Britain and elsewhere in the US. It is impossible to say what difference this had made to our staff, to have all these extra hands on deck—not to mention the excitement of fellowshiping with all these tremendous young Christians from such varied backgrounds! *God is so good!*


