




They come with mixed emotions; memories of mommies that they love, but who have been absent much of the time; ailing grandmothers struggling with infants in their old age; poverty-stricken homes that have been all they know, and some happy days mixed up with traumatic experiences. Sometimes *it all spills out* over supper, or in the car on the way home from the store. Last Sunday, after Mother’s Day Service at Church, one of our little boys suddenly blurted out, “Sometimes I think my dad is dead and then I remember he isn’t.” It’s an open ended statement that asks, “Where is he is he and why does he never call?” It hides a world of rejection, that makes you want to love harder, hug more often and pour your life into these beautiful children, who have experienced *so much* pain.

But I absolutely love that evening phone call, to tell me how many men gave their hearts to the Lord in the prisons of Argentina today. Last night he called to tell me the latest incredible report of how the Gospel is transforming lives and how he is sure that the last great revival that this world will ever see is breaking out already in prisons all around this world!

"Will you pray for me?"

That is the nightly song as we tuck everyone into bed at Adullam House. *With that many children in one house it can take quite a long time to make sure everyone is prayed for!* On very busy evenings we all stand in a circle and pray together. Coreen wants me to pray for "no bad dreams", Annangel wants me to say "and thank you Jesus that Annangel can stay with us for a very long time". They want prayer for his mommy.
