

I have to tell you the whole story for you to understand the miracle! An old newsletter of ours, from September 1999, closes with this picture of Willie and his family. Willie was one of Pete's first converts in Lurigancho Prison, in Peru. At that time, he had been out of Prison, for over two years. His first goal as a new convert, had been to reunite his little family. We searched for Willie in 1999, and found him living with his wife and two sons in poverty stricken conditions.

I quote from that old newsletter: "*I had never seen such squalor. The once-orange, plastic sofa was so full of holes that his little six year old sat playing with the foam filling. There was nothing else in the room.* The children were both sick and the stench of their illness filled the place. But in the middle of this, we sat and discussed the need to get the Gospel into Piura and the outlying villages". Willie's new dream, was to build a boat and sail it up the Amazon to reach the lost. **Now in October 2014 the oldest 8 children of Adullam House are going on a missions trip, to serve at the orphanage and outreach center that Willie and his wife went on to build.**

In October, our children will learn that they are *part of the solution and not part of the problem. Also we will have the great privilege of serving this little family who found new life in the Gospel and then gave up their lives to reach the lost!*

This week marks the 70th Birthday of Brother Pete Spackman, the founder of New Convictions Outreach and Adullam House.

As sprightly as ever, Brother Pete continues to minister in the prisons of the USA and beyond. After decades of ministry, he is seeing the fruit of his labors worldwide. It is not unusual for Pete to drive through a fast food restaurant, only to be greeted on the intercom by an excited voice asking, "Brother Pete—is that you?" An ex-inmate, now free in more ways than one, may be holding down a job for the first time in their life! Pete often drives thousands of miles across States to a prison, and finds an inmate transferred there, that he led to the Lord in a different State! After being transferred, they almost invariably, have already set that Prison on fire for the Lord and are waiting for Pete to get there, to start the School of Christ with their new converts.

A radio broadcast reported, a few years ago, that revival had broken out in a mountainous region, near Lima. No one could account for it. No evangelist had been there to preach. It was later discovered that the revival was sparked by the work of two ex-inmates, recently released from Lurigancho prison, where Pete had been faithfully ministering the School of Christ, for four years!

As our oldest Adullam House children prepare to head to the mission field in Peru, they too will be helping a ministry started in the Amazon Jungle, by one of Pete's converts many years ago. What an amazing privilege! From South America, to the United Kingdom, From Africa, to Thailand and beyond to Russia and Siberia, the Prisons of the world have been impacted by the ministry of this man—and he doesn't anticipate slowing down the pace any time soon!

A fresh Challenge!

He is almost 12, but could pass for 9 years old! One of his front teeth haven't quite come in yet so it gives him a decidedly lopsided smile. He has missed most of his schooling for the past few years and has a history of hopping out of classroom windows when he doesn't want to work! Fortunately his small build helps him to fit in with classmates a few grades younger than himself.

After a bumpy start to his new life at Adullam House and an episode of **stomping out of the classroom (quite a showdown)** - an apology to his teacher was in order. Since then he was made **Student of the Week** by Ms. Selman, (amazing!), and has won everyone's heart with his fast talk and funny ways.
