This year saw the beginning of a new challenge for Adullam House. We visited Eastern Europe early in 2016, and lost our hearts to some beautiful kids that we met there. These were children who had aged out of state orphanages at age 16 and would have been abandoned on the streets without God's people caring for and housing them. We have been blessed to come alongside this ministry that has provided for them and to partner with them in this great work. Adullam House has been instrumental in bringing one of their young men to the USA to attend bible college. Artiom had lived in an orphanage with 700 other children most of his life. After giving his heart to the Lord he has gone on to become a certified soccer coach and last year told us of his dream to "go to seminary". Thanks to the kindness of Summit International School of Ministry in Grantville, PA, he was given a scholarship. Adullam House flew him over and he is now part of their student body, growing in God and in faith. Amazing!

Another of their young ladies received a proposal of marriage from a young man in the US who had ministered in the work overseas. Adullam House stepped in and was privileged to host their wedding at our church, with the receptions at our pavilion. It was absolutely a fairy tale come true for this young couple and how blessed we were to witness it. No matter how devastated and lost a life may be, when Jesus steps in miracles happen.

Some of our older Adullam House kids are becoming young men and women. Last week one of our 18 year old girls had the amazing opportunity to go with a senior staff member to pick up a new born from the hospital who was coming to Adullam House. She proudly sent us a picture of herself cradling the tiny baby. Naomi choked back the tears as she looked at the picture. "Oh my gosh!", she gasped! "Our babies are bringing home our babies!" How true! Now it is their turn to step up and become what God intended for them to be. They, above all people, know how these children feel.

Years ago, a movie was released called "Failure to Launch". It told the story of a young man who still hung on to his mother's apron strings and hadn't left home. The title of that movie has been stuck in my head lately. We cannot 'fail to launch' these young people. God has plans for them beyond our wildest dreams. We need to launch them to become the best that they can be in the Lord, and to become the answer to this world's problems. Perhaps some of our Adullam House children will be ministering in Eastern Europe to kids who have known heartache all of their lives. **Who knows?** They, above all people, know what these kids feel.

God is rewriting the story—their stories! He never ceases to amaze me. He continues to use the most unlikely ones to accomplish His task, so that the Glory might be of God and not of us. We are excited to see where God is going with this unfolding story of love in their lives. Meanwhile, we are delighted to partner in this great work of rescuing even more kids at risk.
