Living in drug dens, hotel rooms that were set on fire as they slept, and bouncing from caregiver to caregiver, are just a few of their tragic stories.

But thankfully, this Christmas they will be with the staff of Adullam House. They will be protected and loved, and yes—I'm afraid—just a little bit spoiled!

And despite the pandemic the Lord has enabled us to continue building the school for our orphanage in Kenya, Africa!

At the beginning of 2020, our men returned from Homa Bay to the states on the last flight permitted to enter the country. The lockdown had taken a new turn. During that trip they had purchased the land, met with the builders, and put into place everything needed to permit the building of the first six classrooms.

The building of the school has been made possible by funds designated for this purpose by the kindness of one young donor, whose heart God had touched. The buildings you see below are our first 6 classrooms.

Six more classrooms and an office/restroom wing are soon to follow—God willing!





We had planned to take a work team from Alabama to Kenya this summer. Our flights, of course, were cancelled because of the shut-downs in Nairobi. Nevertheless, the workers continued building as we watched longingly from across the world. We studied every picture that was sent to us. We hurt for them as the power poles went down during heavy rains and the well pump stopped working. We sent some funds to pay for food and wages, as well as a generator so they could have water and electricity again. Finally we saw the big red roof go onto the schoolhouse!
