

Or- who is doing what, where and when at Adullam!

Many of you saw the exciting pictures from a couple of months ago, when AIM was able to send a group of young girls from Narok, Kenya to see the ocean for the first time. These are young ladies in their teens who lived in the offgrid bush area, and who have been rescued from the horrors of female genital mutilation. It was such a privilege to bless them with this trip.

AIM is now planning our first medical missions trip to Kenya for this summer. A team





heading out to the remotest parts of the area occupied by the Maasai tribe. Many of the natives of this area are afflicted by trachoma, a form of blindness often transmitted by flies. It can often be easily eliminated by antibiotics. Some of our team, Josh and Justin, were privileged to be told they were the first Americans to set foot in one of these tribal areas.

Each member of the medical team will pay their own way but we are still raising the remaining \$5,000 needed for the medicines that will be purchased in Nairobi, and \$2,000 to rent a 4-wheel drive vehicle that is capable of getting the supplies through rough terrain. If you would like to help with this need and would like to be a part of this miracle for people who have never seen a doctor in their lives, please give the best gift you can.
